

All men went down on their fours to offer assistance/advice to Chris, as a verdict was delivered on the car's problem (for those of you who want the technical details, contact Chris directly).



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

Round 1 - Feb 13 & 14

Mount Panorama. Bathurst

Our club being represented by Bruce Kennedy, having his first championship run in the GT4 and Penny driving the Datsun 1200.

Practice on Saturday saw Penny record a 37.2 on her second of two runs - .72 better than last year's time of 37.92 in the 120Y.

Saturday night was spent at a dinner to celebrate this very special occasion. The best words of the night being spoken by Leo Geoghan who said he was glad to see motor <u>sport</u> was still happening. One older member of the BLCC started his speech by thanking the football club for inviting him along, started not once but a number of times, before eventually being wheeled off - all good stuff.


Bruce ran a best of 35.8 for second in his class of two behind Robin Staples' very quick RX2 32.29.
