

Our next social event is the cricket match and picnic with the Aston Martin Club. I would ask for maximum attendance to make this a memorable event.


The forthcoming weekend away has been well organised and looks like being a fun weekend. Please call Penny Creighton if you wish to go.





Meeting closed at 9:00 pm.



The vehicle was shipped to London two weeks ago on the MSC vessel Samia.


22 and proceeds through France and Spain to Portugal.

At the time of putting pen to paper, the scores were not known to me, due to the lack of a calculator on the day, so I will leave the placings up to your imagination.


I trust that everybody present on the day had a good time and I would like to thank all of you for your attendance.





























INTER-CLUB CRICKET MATCH AMOC US TSCC

for the concept and the organisation.



HE clock is ticking for owners of cars manufactured before 1986, with leaded supergrade fuel unlikely to be available in your neighbourhood service station after 2000.

The Federal Government seems committed to force consumers on to a lead-free diet sooner rather than later and, according to the Australian Institute of Petroleum (AIP), the swing to unleaded is gathering momentum. At the end of last year, unleaded petrol accounted for 55.6 per cent of total petrol sales.

That's all bad news for the owners of an estimated five to six million cars on the roads still using leaded. Of course, some of the less healthy of these oldies will be out of commission by the turn of the century, but many other lead-sipping cars will still be in good order.

Motorists have been getting strong hints from the authorities that they should prepare for a lead-free landscape. Already the dreaded leaded is costing two cents a litre more than ULP. And there have been hints of an even greater impost on the anti-social super grade.

Half-lead petrol is going well but many pre-1986 cars won't run satisfactorily on the light-lead brew now produced by Shell.

Engine pinging and a fall in performance are familiar symptoms.

The AIP forecasts that leaded fuel will account for just 10 per cent of total petrol sales by the end of this decade.

Its availability after that is very much in the hands of the fuel companies.

Lead was introduced to fuel for two reasons — to control detonation and to provide lubrication to the valve mating surfaces to prevent sticking. Without it, many older engines can be vulnerable.

Those who cannot afford to, or do not wish to, update to a newer vehicle are nervously seeking cheaper alternatives.

Fuel additives are one solution, but not an entirely satisfactory one. Another is to install a late-model engine.

One consideration is to reduce the compression ratio and fit hardened valve inserts.

A new jigger called the Fuelstar in-line cartridge might help. It allows pre-1986 (leaded petrol) cars to run on unleaded fuel without pinging, loss of performance or valve deterioration.

The Fuelstar is a fuel catalyst which is fitted to the fuel supply line in the engine compartment. It leaches minuscule quantities of tin from metal alloy pellets into the unleaded fuel supply before it reaches the carburetor or injection system.

In changing the combustion characteristics and reducing the accumulation of carbon, it also allows engines designed to run on leaded fuel to run happily on ULP without any modifications. The tin, a substitute for evil tetraethyl lead, acts as a catalyst and provides the necessary lubrication.

The product, about the size of a sausage, has been on the UK market for six years and is now fitted to more than 3,000 pre-1986 Australian cars.

Fuelstar Australia, the local importer, claims that by improving the efficiency of the combustion process the cartridge increases engine power, promotes easier starting, generates fuel savings, lowers exhaust gas temperatures and reduces toxic emissions.

Also, the tin in the cartridge impregnates and therefore protects the engine's valve seats.

The Herald has not yet tried the cartridge, but independent reports from qualified mechanical engineers verify the manufacturer's claims.

Pricing starts at \$249 for a four-cylinder car, with cartridges for the big sixes and V8s costing \$469. Fuelstar Australia can be contacted on Freecall number 1 800 624007.
