
# Sunday 30 October



The play follows the life of the successful American painter Jonathan Waxman. Waxman has a waiting list of buyers for his as yet unpainted works - sight unseen - at outrageous prices. In London for his first European retrospective, he decides to stay a night with his first lover Patricia, who he has not seen for 15 years, and her archaeologist husband Nick. Waxman's success has left him feeling he has somehow lost his way, and he hopes to find that "something" again by visiting Patricia. However Nick is more than a little resentful of Waxman's intrusion in their lives and the evening is fraught with cutting remarks. Biting dialogue and an excruciatingly uncomfortable situation are at times brilliantly executed. The play jumps around in time from the young lovers, to Waxman's exhibition, to an interview with Greta (the German critic). Greta's piercing questions about his success, the truth in his art, the compromises he has made and his Jewishness. expose Waxman for the fraud that he is.








# "HERE COMES SANTA CLAUS, HERE COMES SANTA CLAUS ... "


