Cost for 2008 has been negotiated to continue at \$55 per night (same as this year) &, as most know, this cost is met totally or at least substantially by our raffle income on the night.

PLEASE HELP US TO ANSWER A FEW QUESTIONS.....

Although we received many favourable comments from those attending the Christmas

Party/Presentation Dinner, a Club Member has written to the Committee with some suggested changes to the arrangements for future functions

In order to be democratic about this, and given that others may hold similar views, we have decided to give all Members the opportunity to comment and express their preferences. To this end, we would very much appreciate your responses to the questions below. Any additional comment you may wish to make will also be welcomed.

Our only aim is to fulfil the wishes of the *majority* of Members in the arrangements for this evening.

1) Food Service

It has been suggested that we move back to a table service meal arrangement, rather than continue with the buffet arrangement of the past two years. The suggestion is that buffet food is never as good as table-served meals, and that the buffet food this year was not as good as the previous year.

For your information, table-served meals could be expected, with our relatively large numbers attending this function, to be the usual arrangement of two starter/main/sweets dishes served on an alternate basis. Choices would thus be limited to the two dishes served.

The buffet offers a wider array of choices of food and the ability to select as much or as little of each dish as desired.

Based on the packages offered by the Club this year the table service was \$5.00 per head less than the buffet

Question: Are you happy to leave the choice to the organizers or is there a preference for table service?

2) Alcohol/Drinks

It has further been suggested that catering arrangements for the Christmas Party/Presentation Night, and also the Pride of Ownership Day, be changed to only include pre dinner drinks in the package price. Any subsequent alcohol/drinks to be purchased separately as required on an individual basis.

The understandable reason for this suggestion is that those who drink little or no alcoholic or other beverages "subsidise" those who may drink more.

Question: Do you wish to retain the combined food/wine packages, or would you prefer to move to a food-only basis (including only pre-dinner drinks) with any subsequent alcohol/drinks to be purchased separately?

(<u>Note:</u> a food-only catering arrangement *may* be available at Castle Hill RSL. This is still under discussion. It is not currently available at Oatlands House. If *insisted* upon by us, Oatlands House would make it available to us to avoid the loss of our Club's business –

but only at a significantly increased meal cost per head for **all attendees** to cover the cost of additional bar and waiting staff. Further, wine would be made available only at higher "restaurant prices" for single bottle purchases as opposed to the cheaper price made available to us for one selected brand of red & white wine *in bulk* in a combined food/wine package. The Committee would accordingly <u>not</u> propose to pursue this.)

3) Seating Arrangements

Those attending this year's Christmas Party will recall that there were designated table seating arrangements. This was adopted by us on a well-intentioned basis to provide an orderly seating arrangement under which guests of members were properly seated with their hosts, good friends were seated together, singles were properly balanced with other members, etc. It is believed that most were happy with this arrangement.

As an alternative to this arrangement, it has been suggested that, at the time of seeking acceptances for this event, Members be asked in advance with whom they would prefer to sit. If a majority of Members prefer to adopt this, the organising Committee would of course endeavour to meet all requests, but would need to retain final discretion as to seating in line with table sizes and seating availability, overlapping requests etc.

<u>Question</u>: Should we include this option in future invitations to the Christmas party?

You are actively encouraged to respond to the questions above, plus provide any additional feedback you may wish to offer, to provide us with the knowledge of what a majority of Members wish.

Please <u>preferably</u> e-mail either of the Committee members below or, if you would prefer, phone us if you would prefer a two-way discussion on the matters.

Sunday, 28th.October, dawned sunny, and dry, for one of the most enjoyable days on the T.S.C.C.'s calendar - a chance to see a large proportion of the Club's classic cars, coupled with an excellent lunch in an historic setting.

As usual, I arrived late, trying to cram too much into a day.I snuck a quick visit into the combined Aston Martin, Triumph & Austin-Healey Concourse at Henley, just down the road. As Lester Gough was in residence there, my short look around took rather longer than planned! By the time I drove into the parking area at Oatlands House, all the vehicles were assembled, and Club members seen enjoying a few preluncheon bevies.

It would be difficult to replicate the facilities we enjoy at Oatlands

- good secure parking in the grounds, with ample room to display the vehicles, and walk around them. People gathered in groups, chatting, with a champagne cocktail, beer, or soft drink available on arrival.

The cars were placed in three rows, some 26 in all, and, one of the nice things about our Club, a wide range of vehicles from all eras of motoring, spanning from the Clark's 1919 Hudson, through to the latest MX-5.

At mid-day, we moved into the Rebecca Suite in the old homestead, and sat in groups at seven large tables scattered around the two rooms. Entrees arrived straight away, the choice alternating between a Caesar Salad sans anchovies, and a Linguini Pasta with smoked salmon. The wines included an excellent Misty Mooring Dry White, of which I could only have two (glasses that is, not bottles!).

Main course consisted of a Striploin on an onion & bacon ragout, or a chicken breast topped with a mixture of mushrooms, and eschallots.

Dessert followed, being a choice of a rather tasty apple & rhubarb
