# Another Jaguar Birthday

Just in case we have forgotten, 2007 in the 40th birthday of the retrospectively named Series "One-and-a-half" E type. This model, officially listed as a Series One car, was born in 1967, and is interesting in that it was an interim model between the Series One and Two E types and, during its short life of little over a year, contained elements of both series. The early cars retained the Series One toggle switches, door handles and window winders but, during the model run, the rocker switches and recessed door handles and "safety" window winders appeared, which became standard fitment on the Series Two cars. The early cars also had a starter button but later cars had a key start which was carried over to the Series Two cars. In fact, in the "Original E Type" book, there is a photograph of a car with both! Maybe the factory was having a bad day that day!! The Series "One-and-a-Half" cars were the first E types to have uncovered headlights. The treatment was more subtle than those on the Series Two cars which always remind me of frog's eyes (with apologies to Series Two owners!). The headlights didn't poke out as far as the Series Two cars. These cars are relatively rare. An example of this is the fact that only 374 Series "One-and-a-Half" coupes were made in right hand drive. I am fortunate to own one of them. One other feature that was retained from the Series One cars was the small bonnet aperture. This small opening was made 68% bigger on the Series Two cars in the interests of better cooling. In my humble opinion this rather spoilt the overall frontal appearance of the Series Two E types.

So, happy birthday to all Series "One-and-a-Half" E types!

# 1096 Restoration Update from Joe Marchione

This is the next installment from Joe Marchione in his quest to restore 1096 to a terrific Elite again. Read what Joe has to say as the bills pile up and progress is made. –Ed.

The restoration of 1096 is still moving along. It has slowed down some as we've been waiting for some parts to arrive from Bill Hutton. We are also putting together an order (windscreens, lights and various body parts) for David Mousley. We've had to change some things up on the front suspension. 1096 is an S-1 but, due to the previous damage to the left front suspension we've changed to an S-2 trunnion set. It's a much better arrangement and, most importantly, the S1 trunions are no longer available. Suits me, as I never liked the S-1 trunion arrangement. Bill is supplying a new set of S-1 wishbones, stainless pipes and resonators and a load of bearings, bushings, mounts, etc, so new blue 1096 should be back on her toes soon. I'm sure I've sent you a photo but just in case here's another shot.

Hi Greg, You asked me if I was getting afraid of the project costs? Afraid to is a good way to put it. Yes, restoration projects - Be afraid

... be VERY afraid!! When I first decided to take this step, I had intended to attack the most glaring issues, (shell integrity, left suspension, and motor rebuild) and put on a fresh coat of paint and go driving. HA! What a joke. How naive. The first step on this path to financial ruin was choosing a shop who I knew could do the job - right. What I should have done is drag it down to the local body guy who would have slapped a little resin on her and sprayed 'er up real good (this is a joke of course although I do know a guy who could have done a fair job on the body but, as it turned out, there were much deeper issues - some could have killed me). Of course once the paint came off you could see the extent of the work that needed to be done to get her right. Not the disaster that I've seen some guys tackle (and god bless those industrious souls) but serious stuff. As much as I gasp at every invoice, I'm really glad I took the path I did. Hutton did a fantastic job on the motor and I could not have had a better guy working on the shell. What attention to detail. Greg is a real glass and paint artist. So what has it cost?



\$8.8 K for the motor. \$35 K so far to R&R. \$5.5 K for trans, rear rebuild. \$3 K for suspension parts (so far). So that's what? About \$50 K+?

And what's left. More parts, glass, interior, put it all together. Another \$25K? Does it ever end?

No, but at some point soon 1096 will be cool and beautiful and mechanically correct again. Although I've had a fair amount of anxiety about the process and **the money** (did I mention **the money**?), I'm beginning to believe it will all be worth it. Our Elites are little jewels. Automotive works of art. Unique in look, and design. The only car I know of ever produced in such a revolutionary way. I felt I had an obligation to 1096 to bring her back. It was either do it or get her into the hands of some other enthusiast.

I'll keep you up to date on progress and contribute more to the news letter when we get to the next significant point.
