Origin of The Brass Monkey

It was necessary to keep a good supply of cannon balls near the cannons on old war ships. But how to prevent them from rolling about the deck was the problem. The best storage method devised was to stack them as a square based pyramid, with one ball on top, resting on four, resting on nine, which rested on sixteen.

Then we will take a leisurely country drive via the famous O'Connell Hotel for bite to eat and refreshments.




O'Connell Hotel since 1865

Classic Cars In New Zealand

Kerry and I recently toured the south island of New Zealand to reacquaint ourselves with the beauty and splendour of this spectacular country having visited there many years ago. I won't bore you with too many of the finer details of our holiday but I thought TSCC members may be interested in the classic cars we happened to come across in NZ.

One day out of Christchurch saw us in the coastal town of Oamaru. (By the way don't miss the penguins there if you visit this town!). Parked by the roadside near the town centre was the one and only Jaguar E type we came across in the entire 2 weeks. I was also passed by a burbling, left hand drive, Chevrolet Camaro, looking quite resplendent in its gleaming dark green paintwork.

The next lot of classics we saw were, not one, but four Jaguar Mark 10's, all parked in a row! In Dunedin we visited an historic home called Olveston House. This impressive building was the residence of a wealthy Jewish trader whose spinster daughter inherited the home and its contents when her parents passed on. She lived in the home until her death and, as there was no family to inherit the property, she bequeathed it to the city of Dunedin. The house was full of magnificent furniture and other wonderful collectables, but what really caught my eye and interest was these four Jags parked in the driveway. Apparently one could hire these cars out for a tour of the city and they were obviously being used for that purpose, with a visit to Olveston House being part of the itinerary. Of further interest was the 1923 Fiat tourer which was the Jewish family's daily driver, parked in a glass sided garage near the house. It had been totally restored and was given the occasional run so we were told.

Our next stop was Invercargill. We went there specifically to visit Stewart Island. Sadly it was a drizzly, miserable day on the day we flew over there but we were still able to appreciate its beauty. On to more important things, our next classic vehicle sighting! Those of you who saw the movie "The World's Fastest Indian" may recall that some of the film was shot at Invercargill. On the approach to the city there was a large sign proclaiming that this place was indeed the home of "The World's Fastest Indian". This I had to see! We briefly visited the beach where, in the movie, Burt Munroe raced the local bikies, but of greater interest was that we saw the actual Indian bike that was raced by Munroe and the replica that was used in the

movie. Would you believe they were in the middle of a hardware store of all places! Also in the store were a vintage Velocette, a Vincent and (I think) a Triumph chassis with an Austin 7 motor, mounted crossways in the frame! What a handful that would be! While we were there a group of "vintage" bikers arrived for a look, their old machines parked in a neat row outside the shop!

When we were in Queenstown we didn't see any 2 or 4 wheeled classics but went for a ride on a multi-wheeled classic, namely the famous Kinston Flyer steam train. This train used to ply between Kinston and Gore but is now a working museum piece using a mixture of old carriages dating back to the late 1890's.
