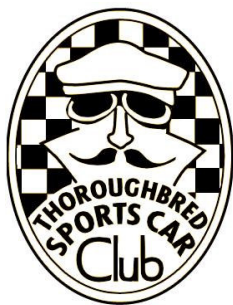

TSCC SPORTING REPORT

Grant Liddell's Hillclimb Domination – 6 Wins from 6 Starts

Grant continues to punch well above his weight and has provided the following report.

Round 6 at Ringwood

I missed practice due to being unable to work on the car during the week as I was busy working (which pleased Penny). Most of you are probably unaware that I have been engaged to design a 2.9km motor race circuit and associated facilities at Balickera, 12km north of Raymond Terrace, on what was part of the MGCC Newcastle land (that's a story for another day). Needless to say the circuit is taking priority.

Come Sunday and I saw that my opposition, now down to one, a Datsun 1200 coupe which was previously campaigned successfully on the circuits by John Boston, had done no less than 20 practice runs on the Saturday. I felt comfortable though as my previous best time from my last Ringwood appearance in 2001 was quicker than the opposition's best time in practice. By day's end I left the record at 33.39 secs (was 33.52 set in 2005 by Aaron Osborn in a coupe similar to mine). I was very pleased to finish in front of a number of cars that on paper should have been quicker. In fact, I finished 8th outright of the sedans. Interestingly the split times showed that I was slowest of the top 10 sedans to the first split, sixth quickest through the second section and fourth quickest through the third downhill section. Not bad for the smallest capacity car in the top ten sedans which included two four wheel drive forced induction cars which were both slower down the hill.

A new POV 1 in car camera captured very well the steering wheel work required. With just the King Edward Park round to go my championship lead is now unassailable.

Round 7 at King Edward Park

An interesting day with, once again, just the two of us in class. The weather, and hence the track, was not conducive to quick times although I almost managed to match my previous best on my fastest run which included a badly missed gear. This caught my attention as it occurred on the fastest section of the track and I was left drifting towards the armco. The in car camera, now helmet mounted, caught this well. My win at this event sees me with six wins from the six events contested this year.

Throughout the year the fields have seemed a bit light with only five contenders in my class. Even so, I was more than pleased with my times as they generally saw me well placed overall with two records broken.

Unfortunately I will miss the Australian Hillclimb Championships, this year being held in Victoria, as I will be in Cologne Germany for the Professional Motorsport Circuit Owners, Investors and Suppliers' Forum. I am looking forward to learning a great deal more about circuit design and operation while there.

Malcolm Stephen – My First Supersprint at Eastern Creek 18th October

I arrived at Eastern Creek for my first time as a competitor with the threat of rain, a tyre with unnerving tread cracks (put on the inside rear just in case) and my trepidation of approaching turn 1 at 200, which seems wrong in a road car. Oran Park is going, so what are you going to do – just have a go.

There were 22 first timers at the Creek and we were given a couple of laps familiarisation with experienced passengers, which was really useful and much better than the usual follow the leader with no passengers allowed. The format was a warm up, 4 timed laps and a cool down half lap with 16 cars out at a time. However, it ended up with 5 and 6 timed laps which while a little confusing, provided many more laps than usual and therefore was a welcome bonus. Definitely the most laps I've had at any Supersprint which necessitated a fuel top-up after the 3rd session (I'm told that WRX's are susceptible to fuel starvation with less than half a tank at the track).

I was pretty happy with my best time of 2:05 in the third session while chasing down and passing a newer and more powerful WRX. In the next session, he chased me and I did a 2:09 – I guess it's easier to chase than be chased. I still

need to learn the track more, particularly braking for and getting more speed through turn 1 (the car feels very light there), the apex on turn 2 and which gear on the way out (power out in 3rd or short shift to 4th). If I can sort that out, I might see sub 2 minutes and still be able to drive it home.

I look forward to hearing from any club members who are out there competing in motor sport.

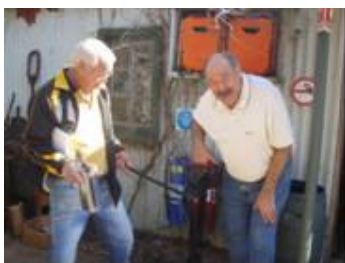

The Arcadian Artists invite you and your friends to come and enjoy our unique annual exhibition in the rural district of northern Sydney.

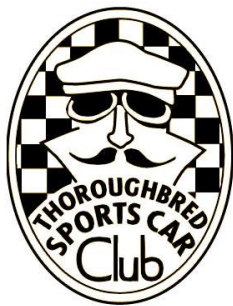
