 - Jill worked atGreat UniversalStores






Our Family

- Old mansion development killed by 17% interest rates



 recruited others in church





ABC, RCN & PAUL TERRY

- 1994 & 1995 conducted a half-hour talk back segment with Lisa Forrest every third Thursday night on ABC radio
- Purchased the moribund magazine Racing Car News in 1982
 - On sold it as a more modern format, appropriate for the times, with increased circulation and advertising revenue.
- Had a dream job during the 1990s buying cars for Paul Terry's Museum in WA
 - Highlights included buying 'Genevieve' for a record-breaking £285,302
 - Frank Matich's AGP-winning McLaren M10B
 - In conjunction with an employee of Paul's, we bought some 50 to 60 cars.


- Served a term on the Board of the Australian Motor Sport Commission (AMSC), the commercial arm of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sports Ltd in March 2000
 - During that term, the AMSC negotiated the sale of AVESCO. The funds generated established the Australian Motor Sports Foundation whose charter was to foster the careers of promising young Australian racing and rally car drivers including Mark Webber and Daniel Ricciardo and probably Oscar Piastri

- Won the Frank Matich Trophy in 1994 for Group M Sports Racing Cars, 1961 to 1965




