





Mt. TARRENGOWER - a silent witness

On 26th September 1836, Major Thomas Mitchell passed south of Mt Tarrengower on his return to Sydney after exploring the country he called "Australia Felix". He took bearings of the mountain to assist in making a map of the area.

The first European settlers to arrive in the Maldon area were pastoralists who grazed sheep and cattle. Land was taken up in 1839 by Jachlan MacKinnon, who cattle is run Turringover. Charles Thatcher, a famous goldfields minstrel of the times, wrote a ballad called "Rush Away", its chorus commencing 'Rush, my jolly pals, rush away, To Bryants Ranges, rush away'.

Mount Tarrengower is roughly, give or take a few kilometres, the centre of Victoria. Near the table to the east of the tower is a survey point marker, with another directly beneath the centre of the tower. These survey points are still used by surveyors today in identifying other feature locations in the recion.

Tarrengower is thought to be an Aboriginal word meaning 'big rough full'. The birth of the mountain helongs to a volcanic period in the geological history of central Victoria. It is made from horasfels, a metamorphic rock, which has been heated and hardened by volcanic action.

The road up the mountain was constructed so that the tower could be dragged up the hill by horses. It was first used for a hill climb for motor cars in 1928. 
- We had more than 1,800 photos to choose from






